

The Legislator Scorecard is a summary of the voting and co-sponsorship records of each state legislator on some of the issues important to New York physicians during the 2022 legislative session.

Physicians should be aware that there are a variety of factors related to how a legislator may vote on a particular issue, some of which are not reflected in a scorecard. These include whether the legislator is a member of the majority or minority party in the Senate or Assembly. Furthermore, in New York State, many political decisions take place behind the scenes. There are instances in which a legislator may help MSSNY by making sure a bad bill never reaches a floor vote, or amends a bill to address the concerns of physicians. Scorecards do not reflect that "value" element.

Both membership in MSSNY and monetary contributions to MSSNYPAC are what makes this work possible and what keeps us working on behalf of New York physicians and their patients. Not only do we work proactively to help pass legislation to address impediments physicians face in delivering care, but we also help defeat regressive and inappropriate scope of practice expansions put forward by other interest groups. The collective voice of physicians represented by MSSNY is vitally important and your support is crucial. Thank you.

#### **The seven bills supported by MSSNY on the scorecard include:**

- **A879/S8113 – Same Specialty Review By Health Plan**
  - Requires health insurers to use physicians in the same specialty when conducting reviewing claims or prior authorization requests.
- **A1741/S5299 – Limits Copay Accumulators**
  - Prohibits health insurers from preventing patients from using prescription discount cards/coupons to meet their deductibles.
- **A3276/S5909 – Limits Mental Health Step Therapy**
  - Prohibits health insurers from imposing step therapy requirements for mental health medications.
- **A9687/S9079 - Protects Physicians Who Provide Reproductive Care**
  - Protects physicians from sanction in New York State for providing health care services prohibited in other states that are legal in New York (consistent with MSSNY Policy 5.997).
- **A10502/S9113 - Expands Red Flags & Background Checks**
  - Expands background checks for the purchase of firearms.
  - Expands the application of “red flag” laws, which require the removal of weapons from NY residents at high risk of causing harm to themselves or others (consistent with MSSNY Policies 260.895 and 260.898).

- **A6256/S5055 – Telehealth Payment Parity**
  - Requires health insurers to pay for services delivered via telehealth at amounts equal to comparable services delivered in-person.
- **A9908/S8299 – Gold Card Bill**
  - Establishes a “gold card” process for physicians, exempting them from prior authorization requirements if they are approved at least 90% of the time for that procedure.

**The four bills opposed by MSSNY on the scorecard include:**

- **A6770/S74 – Wrongful Death Expansion**
  - Significantly expands the damages awardable in a wrongful death lawsuit.
- **A3470C/S2521C – Facility Fee Disclosure**
  - Requires the disclosure of facility fees not covered by insurance, including by employee physicians of facility fees charged by their employer.
- **A273/S4640 – Opioid Prescribing Alternatives**
  - Requires discussion of alternatives to opioids prior to issuance of first opioid prescription for musculoskeletal pain (except for post-surgery, cancer, or hospice).
- **A6008-E/S9449 – Mental Health Counselors Diagnosis**
  - Expands list of mental health care providers can diagnose.
